In a vision to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in 1935, the Lord revealed a powerful prayer that He wanted everyone to say--the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy--and He promised extraordinary graces to those who would recite it: "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death.... Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy....
